

Early sign-up is needed by Tuesday, Sept. 5, as a count is needed for making sure enough free nasal spray sample kits available. They will be given to one participating family member.


Participants will learn how to recognize the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose, as well as appropriate care to provide, based on the individual's breathing and level of responsiveness.
