## From Pastor Chris

The countdown has begun as we find ourselves just over a week away from Christmas Day! It is a holy season, and one I hope will prove a blessing in your spiritual journey again this year.

Sunday we will enjoy the "Lessons and Carols" at 9:00, and the choir will present a Christmas Cantata, "Come to the Manger", at 11:00. Both services are favorites of mine, and I trust for you as well.

On Thursday, December 21, at 3:00, we will host our annual Service of Light, sometimes called the Longest Night Service. This service is designed for those who experience grief and sorrow in a variety of ways during this time of year. While this might be the most wonderful time of year for some, we recognize that for many in our community it is anything but. The heartache of loss, the grieving of broken relationships, ill health, the pain of isolation - all these can make us feel very alone. All are welcome to this service.

Christmas Eve is the following Sunday, and we will have two services, 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Both will be traditional communion and candlelight with a few subtle differences between morning and evening. If you are in the village, come and celebrate the birth of Jesus with us!

No matter where this season takes you, we pray for God's joyous peace in your life.

Finally, as we draw 2023 to a close, I am grateful that we are ending the year with a solid healthy financial status, and we have met our projected need for 2024 planning. The 2024 budget – coming in at \$633,062 – was approved last week following the news that pledges and non-pledged income balanced our projected budgetary need for 2024. 




