

Four weeks ago, you read information about that Advent liturgical colors being purple and blue. Some of the areas to notice these colors have been the Altar cloth. the cloths that hangs over the front of the Pastor's pulpit and from the liturgist's lectern and our Sanctuary wall banners. These cloths are called Paraments.

This Sunday we will leave the Advent season of the purple and blue paraments and experience the Christmas Season with white or gold. This season





of white or gold includes Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, First Sunday after Christmas Day, New Year's Eve or New Year's Day and the Epiphany of the Lord. Added note: Communion Sundays also are white paraments.

Sunday, March 10 - Friday, March 15, 2024 Baldwin, Louisiana

A group of volunteers is forming now to ensure that we can attend in March of next year on the above date.

The registration fee, lodging, and cost of meals must be sent to Sager Brown the first week of January.

Please prayerfully consider being a volunteer. You will have opportunities to check and assemble hygiene kits, volunteer in the community, or provide maintenance on the Sager Brown campus. An added bonus is meeting other Methodists from across the United States that volunteer on the same week. You will come to realize it is a special place as you go about doing the Lord's work.

The total cost to you is \$330 for the week which includes: 5 nights lodging, 13 meals (Sunday & Wednesday nights we are on our own). The registration fee is \$40 and is non-refundable. Therefore, the cost for the lodging and meals is \$290. If there is enough interest, a meeting will be set up to provide further information.
