Did you notice the change of the Doxology (Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow) during worship a couple of Sundays ago? We are currently singing the Doxology tune "Old 100th" (UMH #95) as the Offering plates are brought to the Chancel. On that first Sunday of singing the Old 100th, did it catch you unprepared? Did it almost feel unfamiliar? Prior to that Sunday, we had been singing the hymn tune version of the Doxology, LASST UNS ERFREUN (UMH #96), and we had been

singing it for the past 48 Sundays, excluding a part of Advent, so it is understandable if it almost felt foreign.

Some of you know or realize why the change happened and some of you know that within a few more weeks, it will return to the LASST UNS ERFREUN (UMH #96). What makes these Doxologies different? The most noticeable is the LASST UN ERFREUN has the word "Alleluia" in it 5 times and the Old 100th doesn't have a single "Alleluia". Have you ever heard the phrase "Burying the Alleluias" or just the thought "We don't sing Alleluias during Lent?" Some United Methodist churches refrain from singing "alleluia" and "hallelujah" during Lent. There is no written rule to this thought, but it is more of a reminder and a spiritual practice as we recognize the solemnity of the season and as we look ahead in anticipation of the glorious praises to be sung in celebration of Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Sunday! Refraining from the "Alleluias" can be felt as being a symbolic gesture of "giving up something" just as many of us do during Lent. Therefore, the omission of "Alleluia" for VUMC is part of our Lenten journey, as we begin and continue our time of repentance, solemnity, and preparation that leads us to the "Alleluias" of Easter. We are setting aside this particular expression to aid with our soul-searching, our contemplation, and our repentance. The journey is hard, but Easter is coming!

The Scholarship Committee is currently accepting applications for the Village UMC Scholarship.



On St. Patty's Day, Sunday March 17 the Celtic Breeze Band and the McCafferty Irish Dance Troupe will combine talents to headline Irish cultural festivities at 2:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Garland County Library, 1427 Malvern Ave., H.S. The 5-member Celtic Breeze Band includes VUMC members. David Childs and Alice Canham, Celtic Breeze plays the full tradition of historical Celtic Music, from Irish Gaelic music dating back to the 600's and bringing their music into modern times with country, gospel and popular tunes. The roots of their Celtic music can be traced through the Scotch/Irish communities of the Ozarks, Ouachitas and Appalachia back to the Celtic Isles.

The McCafferty Academy of Irish Dance is owned/operated by Marisa Christiansen, who is Certified with An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha, which is the world's oldest Irish Dancing organization. The McCafferty Academy in Little Rock specializes in traditional Irish Step dancing and Celtic dancing.


