EASTER SEASON

The Easter Season, also known as the Great Fifty Days, begins at sunset Easter Eve and continues through the Day of Pentecost. It is the most joyous and celebrative season of the Christian year. It focuses on Christ's resurrection and ascension and on the givings of the Holy Spirit on the first Easter (John 20:22-23) and the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2).

Lessons from the Acts of the Apostles replace the Lectionary readings from the Old Testament because the early church, empowered by the Holy Spirit, is the best witness to the Resurrection. The ancient Christian name for the festival is *Pasch*, derived from the Hebrew *pesah* ("deliverance" or "passover"), thus connecting the Resurrection to the Exodus. The origin of the English word *Easter* is disputed but may come from the Anglo-Saxon spring goddess Eastre and her festival. *Pentecost* comes from the Greek *pentekoste*, which means "fiftieth." It refers to the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which Greek-speaking Jews called the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1). Early Christians also used the term Pentecost to refer to the Great Fifty Days as a season.

For more information on the Easter Season, look for *The United Methodist Book of Worship* in our church library. The book is found on the United Methodist Resources shelf and the Easter Season information can be found beginning on Page 368.







General Conference of the United Methodist Church

Take a moment to lift a prayer for those who are planning and those who will be attending the General Conference of the United Methodist Church.

The Conference is April 23 - May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The Conference is planned for 862 voting delegates — 55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. Half are to be clergy and half lay. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions but do not have a vote.




Printer Cartridge Mission Project

Tips

Due to the community expecting many visitors for viewing of the Eclipse on April 8, make sure to get everything you need before the weekend of April 5.

Schedule your errands and appointments early.

Don't forget!

Special glasses needed to look at the Eclipse.

Do not use cell phone for taking a picture of the Eclipse.

Have a communication plan with family/friends. Have cash on hand in case of limited Internet access. Buy necessary groceries, medicines and gas early.

Traffic will be heavy and lines for local services will be longer.

More Eclipse Info (The time listed below is when the Eclipse is above HSV)

DATE: Monday, April 8, 2024

Partial Eclipse begins at 12:32 pm (The moment the edge of the Moon touches the edge of the Sun)

Maximum Eclipse is at 1:51 pm (The deepest point of the eclipse, with the Sun at its most hidden)

Totality is at 1:53 pm (3 minutes, 54 seconds) (The moment the edge of the Moon exposes the Sun)

Partial Eclipse Ends at 3:10 pm (The moment the edge of the Moon leaves the edge of the Sun)

Duration: 2 hours, 38 minutes

Remember: NEVER look at the sun with your naked eyes. Permanent damage to your eyesight, and even blindness, may result.

ALWAYS wear certified solar viewing glasses (ISO 12312-2 international standard compliant) when viewing the sun before, during, and after an eclipse.

The ONLY time it is safe to look toward the sun with the naked eye is during the brief period of totality at the height of a total eclipse of the sun.
