




Traditional Eclipse

# UPDATE ON THE FLOWERING OF THE CROSS

The Chimes last week included a picture of a cross on the Worship bulletin board (the bulletin board is in the hallway of the church offices) with an opportunity to adorn the cross with flowers











Pictured is a sample of how to make "stained glass looking paper flowers." Material used is available at the church and a sample available. Those items are a coffee filter, Crayola type markers, small amount of water, pipe cleaner and a paper plate. With coffee filter on a plate, draw with markers any type of design or not a design at all. Use a small drop of water on the Crayola markings and watch it spread. Very little water is needed. The coffee filter will need to dry. There might be a need to pick up the filter and use a paper towel to dab the water off of the plate and set the filter back onto the dry plate. When the filter is dry enough, pick up and use the center of the filter to pull together for looking like a flower and wrapping the pipe cleaner around that center area for securing the flower.

If you have these items at home, feel free to make a "flower" and bring to the church. There are 68 holes for putting flowers on the cross. so many are needed.

from your home. A new project is now available which still includes adorning the cross. This project is making "flowers" or "stained glass looking" artwork to attach to the cross. These flowers are made from coffee filters, Crayola type markers, a very small amount of water, and a pipe cleaner for the steam. Sitting the coffee filter on a plate is needed before using the marker and small amount of water. All these items are available for you at the church with hopes of you making a "one of a kind" artwork" to beautify and reflect new life and creativity on the cross. Check out the picture, to help with a visual. Ladies, you can find the items needed to make your artwork in a tub in the cabinet in the main ladies' restroom. Men your tub of supplies area found up high in the Conference Room. The Conference room is a good place to make your flower, if it is available.



## General Conference of the United Methodist Church

Take a moment to lift a prayer for those who are planning and those who will be attending the General Conference of the United Methodist Church.

The Conference is April 23 - May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The Conference is planned for 862 voting delegates — 55.9% from the U.S., 32% from Africa, 6% from the Philippines, 4.6% from Europe and the remainder from concordat churches that have close ties to The United Methodist Church. Half are to be clergy and half lay. Bishops preside at General Conference sessions but do not have a vote.

# Printer Cartridge Mission Project


We will once again be collecting inkjet cartridges (those we use on our home computers)! This is a





Thank you to those in the past and those in the future who provide this special need!
