



Spirit

"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

~ John 3: 8

Jesus said these words to Nicodemus in the dark of night. Nicodemus had come with questions, and Jesus did provide answers, but not complete clarity. Nicodemus definitely left the encounter with much to think about. We, too, leave encounters with Jesus with much to think about.

Jesus spoke to Nicodemus about the Spirit. Do we really have any idea how much power and might we are talking about when we try to talk about the Holy Spirit? I don't think so. And do we have a grasp on the degree of mystery the Spirit embodies? Again, I don't think so.

What do we, as humans, have at our disposal with which to express ourselves when we try to grasp a spiritual concept? We have words, imagery, movement, dance, painting, drawing, videography, music, singing, shouting. We have bells, kites, sidewalk chalk, fabric, brass, strings, woodwinds, children's voices, adult voices, nature sounds. We have drumming, chanting, marching, waving, humming, photography, poetry. This could go on and on, but I know you get the idea.

When I even approach the idea of discussing and describing the Holy Spirit, what shows up is a myriad of ways we can join with the Creator in a

spirit of creating. How fortunate we are that God invites us into this process!!

We do not know where the Spirit comes from or where it goes, but we can see where it's been, and we can seek to live our lives and shape our days so that we can be vessels of its power, might and mystery.

Pray

Creator God, Redeemer Jesus, Sustaining Spirit, renew us again and make us instruments of your love and peace in this longing world. Amen.






Trinity Sunday

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday and is celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost. On this day, the church rejoices in the impenetrable mystery that God is triune (three-in-one) - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is a day set aside as a reminder of the three different ways we experience the one God whom we worship.

We worship God the Creator; we worship Jesus who experienced the life of a human; and we worship the way God works within us—the Holy Spirit.

The celebration of Trinity Sunday began among Western Christians in the 10th century. While it is clearly taught in the Bible (Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Corinthians 13:14), it can never be understood or rationalized - it can only be accepted by faith.



This Sunday, May 26, is one of our Special Giving Sundays, being United Methodist Peace with Justice Sunday.

Throughout the Bible, God calls on us to challenge unjust leaders and serve as advocates for justice and peace (Micah 6:8, Isaiah 58, 61, and Psalm 34:14). Some of the 2023 grant recipients included The Asuncion A. Perez Memorial Center, in the Manila Episcopal Area Central Conference, providing "Skills Training & Livelihood for Women"; the Church and Society Committee project "Space for Community Dialogue for Peace in District" in Central Congo; and McKinney Memorial United Methodist

Church, Texas Annual Conference "Gun Violence Awareness Day."


