From Pastor Chris

I once read that when the great writer Henry David Thoreau was making a list of essentials for his sabbatical at his famed cabin in the woods, he forgot to include the pencil he was using to compose the list. A rather important item, considering that without a pencil he would have had trouble writing his famous book *Walden* in 1854. Fun fact: Thoreau's father was a pencil maker!

Thoreau doesn't stand alone when it comes to missing the obvious. The Bible tells of a young man who also missed the obvious. We know the story well.

The story is that of the Good Samaritan, and the man was the expert in the law who questioned Jesus, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Yes, we know this story. We have even played the various roles. At one point or another, we have been victimized by life itself and left in a ditch somewhere wondering what would happen next. At times, we have been like the priest or the Levite who was simply too wrapped in themselves to be concerned by a stranger in need. Other times, we have been the Samaritan – the one who showed mercy to another person in need.

Do you remember the first part of Jesus' answer to this man's question, 'what must I do'?

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

Symbols: Crown, Triangle/Interlocking circles representing the Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit), Fish, Alpha/Omega (the beginning and ending), Cross, Cross in a Crown.
