~~ Mark 4: 35-41

Other than on Christmas Eve, we don't often think of Jesus sleeping. Perhaps he slept enough his first thirty years so that he did not need much during the years of his public ministry. High-action people often get by on less sleep that the rest of us. And, with all the people following and clamoring for him, we can imagine his sleep was delayed and cut short numerous times.

This Sunday's gospel does tell of one time when Jesus was asleep, catching a few winks as he and the disciples are crossing the sea in a boat. The growing storm is not enough to wake Jesus, and the worried disciples much go and find him. They are upset with him for sleeping at such a time, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" is their wake-up call. They were finding that their master, great as he was, was not always predictable. As with many of his miracles, he did not always do what they wanted or when they wanted it. He followed his own script on his own terms.

But, if they could not predict *when* he might act, they did have faith that he *would* act and that he would respond on the side of life. "Peace! Be Still!" he calls to the wind and sea, and a dead calm replaces the noisy turbulence. Mark records that they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

Once again, Jesus' response exceeds their expectations. They hoped the storm would get no worse, but Jesus stopped it completely. They sought comforting, but they received deliverance. They hoped for a favor, but they got a miracle.

"Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" was Jesus' probing question to the disciples, and he asks the same of his disciples two thousand years later. We call out to seldom and ask too little of him. We may suspect that Jesus is asleep when we feel we did not get a response, but it is we who need to be awakened to sense his faithful presence, as constant as the rhythmic waves

of the sea. May God give us faith to believe such wonderful claims. We Confess with the hymnwriter Edward Hopper:

As a mother stills her child, Thou canst hush the oceans wild; Boisterous waves obey thy will When thou sayest to them "Be still." Wondrous sovereign of the sea, Jesus, Savior, pilot me.






Have you noticed?
